Rules & Regulations:

1. All garments need to be pinned to a hanger. All garments must be entered on wire hangers or plastic hangers with rotating hooks; plastic tube hangers are not allowed.
2. Entry tag should be securely pinned to each entry with a small safety pin.
3. If a commercial pattern is used, it is suggested that the guide sheet(s) should be brought to judging or be securely pinned to the garment. Please note any changes made to procedures suggested on pattern.

SECTION 1 - BASIC, SIMPLE SEWN GARMENTS

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| 1. Sleeveless Blouse, Shirt (without collar or buttons or zipper, includes tank tops, halter or pullover smock tops) | 5. Sundress, shift, jumper or other simple dress (without closures, collar, or sleeves) |
| 2. Skirt (with waistline casing) | 6. Simple swim or bath cover-up |
| 3. Shorts, pants or skort (with waistline casing) | 7. Simple vest (with or without lining, no closures) |
| 4. P.J. Bottoms (with waistline casing) | 8. Other simple sewn garment that cannot be entered in any other class. |

SECTION 2 - INTERMEDIATE AND/OR ADVANCED SEWN GARMENTS

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| 1. Sleeveless Blouse or Shirt (with buttons) | 18. Tailored jacket or Coat-lined |
| 2. Sleeveless Blouse, Shirt, Shift or Jumper (with zipper) | 19. Tailored Suit |
| 3. Sleeveless Blouse or Shirt (with ruffle, lace or other trim) | 20. Jacket or Coat with Skirt or Pants-lined |
| 4. Other Blouse, Shirt, Shift or Jumper (with sleeves and/or collar) | 21. Vest - lined with closures and or details (buttons, zipper, etc.) |
| 5. Skirt (with zipper and waistband or waist facing, waistband and elastic combination) | 22. Lined Garment not listed |
| 6. Dress (with sleeves, without waistline) | 23. Sports Clothes (Dance, swim or other specialized sportswear) |
| 7. Dress (with waistline) | 24. Pajamas, nightgown or other sleepwear |
| 8. Dress of Knit Fabric | 25. Costume (using purchased pattern) |
| 9. Dress (one piece with sleeves and/or collar and details like top-stitching, ruffles, tucks or trim) | 26. Costume (garment designed by 4-H/FFA member using either no commercial pattern or combining parts of several commercial patterns) |
| 10. Dressy Dress (Short or long) | 27. Outfit for child age 4 and under |
| 11. Tailored Dress | 28. Specialty Fabric Garment (vinyl, Fake fur, Leather, etc.) |
| 12. Shorts, pants or skort (Waistband, waist facing, waistband and elastic combination) | 29. Denim Duds (Garment made of denim fabric) |
| 13. Two-piece outfit - Skirt, shorts, pants, or dress with vest | 30. Stretch Knit Method (Any garment) |
| 14. Two-piece outfit - Skirt, shorts or pants with blouse | 31. Original Design (Garment designed by 4-H/FFA member using either no commercial pattern or combining parts of several commercial patterns. Attached brief description of how designed) |
| 15. Two piece -outfit - Skirt, shorts or pants or dress with jacket | 32. Recycled Garment (Like new and made from another with description of what was done to original garment) |
| 16. Mix and Match (Three coordinating pieces) | 33. Purchased Garment (Decorated by exhibitor with sewn design-applique, ribbon, needle-work or other fabric trim) |
| 17. Outerwear - Simple jacket, poncho, sweatshirt, etc. | 34. Any Other Sewn Garment (Cannot be entered in any other class - Intermediates and/or Advanced) |

SECTION 3 – MISCELLANEOUS

1. First Sewing Box-Handmade (Equipped with at least scissors, needles, thimble, pins, pin cushion, thread, tape measure, and hem gauge. Box should be sturdy. Box must be handmade and can be entered only once.)
2. First Sewing Box-Purchased (Equipped with at least scissors, needles, thimbles, pins, pin cushion, thread, tape measure, and hem gauge. Box must be purchased and can be entered only once.)
3. Stitching Samples (4-H/FFA members are to start sets of samples to be added to each year)
 Sample requirements: (Based on years of sewing)
 1st year- 6 or more 4th year- 24 or more
 2nd year- 12 or more 5th year- complete sets
 3rd year- 18 or more
 All samples should be mounted on notebook paper and fastened in a looseleaf notebook. Label each sample with the technique's name and tell the situation and fabric that requires its use.
4. Apron
5. Tote Bag or Drawstring Bag
6. Backpack
7. Sew on the Bias (ie. necktie)
8. Hat, Purse or Accessory (Made of fabric or felted fibers, may be a set)
9. Hat, Scarf, or other Accessory (using stretch knit method made from knit or fleece - may be a set)
10. Scarf = No Knit
11. Doll Clothes (No hanger needed)
12. Holiday Clothing/Garment
13. Other article not listed (ie. pin cushion, scissor case from felt, etc.)

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SECTION 1 – FLEECE COMPETITION

Fleece Standards: • Fleece must be from current year's fiber clip and represent no more than 15 months worth of growth. • Each fleece must be skirted to ensure it is clean, dry and free of contaminants (e.g., Vegetative Matter (VM), chaff, burrs, manure tags and second cuts). • Minimum staple length of 2.5 inches is recommended. • Place entire fleece in a clear unmarked plastic bag that can be easily opened. • Fleece will be accepted at same time as all other non-perishable household items. Please bring your skirted fleeces to Building 13 on the Saturday before the fair begins, 10am-1pm. See Patricia Sanville or another volunteer.

• The fleeces will be judged on Sunday prior to the fair opening and the fleeces will be displayed in It's Fiber: Functional and Fun! Tent during fair week. (No one will be able to handle your fleeces – they will be safe!)

Overall Section Reserve Champion and Champion winners will receive an award.
