Rules & Regulations:

1. Exhibits must be created by the exhibitor in the current year.
2. A computer with Windows 7 or newer with Microsoft Office 2010 or newer will be available for demonstrations. If a project is made for any other device or operating system, entrant must provide own device for demonstration and judging.
3. Prepare a one to two paragraph cover sheet to include:
 - a. title of the project
 - b. your name and club affiliation
 - c. purpose of the project
 - d. the intended audience *(e.g. classmates, family members, 4-H Club)*
 - e. resources used *(e.g. computer type, software, websites visited, etc.)*.
4. Planning document *(storyboard/flowchart)*: All projects need to display the process used to create the project. This should be specific and as detailed as possible to give the judges the necessary background regarding how it was developed. You may choose to put it on a tri-fold display or bring a loose-leaf notebook with your notes.
5. Exhibitor must be prepared to answer questions about your computer system, its software, your use of various software in developing the project, etc.
