4. No Lego and/or model entries will be accepted.
5. All items must be this year's work.
6. All small crafts should be mounted on a foam board or cardboard base.

## DIVISION 1 – FUNCTIONAL CRAFTS

### Rules & Regulations:

1. Class 2 - For sewn dolls, see 4W (Home Furnishing & Family Life) for appropriate divisions and classes.
2. Class 3 - For all store bought flowers (silk & real) please see 4Y (Flowers) for appropriate divisions and classes.

## DIVISION 2 – PAPER & FASHION CRAFTS

### Rules & Regulations:

1. No Wreaths will be accepted in any class except class 11. Please see 4W (Home Furnishings) for appropriate divisions for fabric and mesh wreaths and 4Y (Flowers) for floral wreaths.

#### **Rules & Regulations:**

- 1. See “General Rules and Regulations” for a complete list.
- 2. All collections must be mounted and secured.
- 3. All items in Divisions 3 (Ag Collection), 4 (Elec. Work), 5 (Woodworking), 6 (Metal), and 7 (Misc.) must be usable. Non-useable items will not be accepted. **Exception:** Division 4, Class 5 (Pictures) and Division 7, Class 4 (Taxidermy).
- 4. All items in Division 4 (Elec. Work), 5 (Woodworking), 6 (Metal), and 7 (Misc.) must be accompanied by a plan, blueprint or drawing used in the construction of the item along with a statement of the intended use. **Exception:** Division 4, Class 4 (Pictures)
- 5. Large items may not be displayed at the discretion of the building superintendents.
- 6. See each division for additional rules.

### DIVISION 1 – FORESTRY

#### **Rules & Regulations:**

- 1. Collections must include where the specimen was collected (i.e. leaf from maple tree, bark from white oak) as well as the state and region/county where collected.

#### **CLASS**

1. Leaf Collection ( <i>10 or more specimens</i> )	4. Bark Collection ( <i>10 or more specimens</i> )
2. Leaf Collection ( <i>25 or more specimens, may include specimens from class 1</i> )	5. Bark Collection ( <i>25 or more specimens, may include specimens from class 4</i> )
3. Leaf Collection ( <i>35 or more specimens, may include specimens from class 1 and 2</i> )	6. Fruit & Nut Collection ( <i>15 or more specimens</i> )
