Rules & Regulations:

- 1. See "General Rules and Regulations" for a complete list.
- 2. All garments need to be pinned to a hanger. Garments must be entered on wire or plastic hangers with rotating hooks; plastic tube hangers are not allowed.
- 3. Entry tag should be securely pinned to each entry with a small safety pin.
- 4. If a commercial pattern is used, it is suggested that the guide sheet(s) should be brought to judging or be securely pinned to the garment. Please note any changes made to procedures suggested on pattern.
- 5. Exhibitors using their clothing for other fair events (i.e. livestock dress-up contests) must have advanced permission to remove their entry from the department or building superintendent. Exhibits may not leave the building until the day of the event and must be returned no later than 8:30 p.m. same day. Exhibitors may not remove the exhibits from their display location. The department or building superintendent will do that. Failure to comply may result in loss of ribbons/premiums.

DIVISION 1 – BASIC, SIMPLE SEWING GARMENTS

CLASS

- 1. Sleeveless blouse/shirt (*without collar, buttons, or zippers, includes tank tops, halter, or pullover smock tops*)
- 2. Skirt (*with waistline casing*)
- 3. Shorts (*with waistline casing*)
- 4. Pants (*with waistline casing*)
- 5. P.J. Bottoms (*with waistline casing*)
- 6. Jumpsuit (*without buttons or zippers*)
- 7. Sundress, shift, jumper or other simple dress (*without closures, collar, or sleeves*)
- 8. Vest (*with/without lining, no closures*)
- 9. Apron
- 10. Tote Bag or Drawstring Bag
- 11. Other simple sewn garment that cannot be entered in any other class

DIVISION 2 – INTERMEDIATE AND/OR ADVANCED SEWN GARMENTS

CLASS

- 1. Sleeveless Blouse or Shirt (*w/o buttons, zippers*)
- 2. Blouse or Shirt (*with sleeves and/or collar*)
- 3. Dress (*with sleeves; with or w/o waistline*)
- 4. Dress (*with sleeves and/or collar; including details like top-stitching, ruffles, tucks, or trim*)
- 5. Dress, Dressy or Formal (*long or short*)
- 6. Tailored Dress (*lined; with/without sleeves*)
- 7. Shorts or Pants (*waistband, waist facing, waistband and elastic combination*)
- 8. Two-piece Outfit (*skirt, short, pant or dress with blouse, vest, or jacket*)
- 9. Mix and Match (*three coordinating pieces*)
- 10. Tailored Jumpsuit (*with buttons, zippers; with/without sleeves*)
- 11. Outerwear (*simple jacket, poncho, sweatshirt etc.*)
- 12. Tailored Jacket or Coat (*lined*)
- 13. Jacket or Coat with Skirt or Pants (*lined*)
- 14. Vest (*lined with closures and/or detail - buttons, zippers, etc.*)
- 15. Sports Clothes (*dance, swim or other specialized sportswear*)
- 16. Pajamas, nightgown, or other sleep-wear

17. Costume
18. Outfit for child age 4 and under
19. Hat, Purse, Tie or Other Accessory
20. Doll Clothes
21. Original Design (*designed by Youth exhibitor*)
22. Recycled Garment (*like new and made from another with description of that was done to original garment; must be wearable*)
23. Other (*not already entered in another class*)

DIVISION 3 – MISCELLANEOUS

Rules and Regulations:

1. Class 1 and 2 are for one time entry. Exhibitors may not enter these classes again in the future years. Exhibitors entering as a junior may not enter again when they become a senior.

CLASS

1. First Sewing Box-Homemade (*Equipped with at least scissors, needles, thimble, pins, pin cushion, thread, tape measure, and hem gauge. Box should be sturdy, MUST be handmade, and entered only once.*)
2. First Sewing Box-Purchases (*Equipped with at least scissors, needles, thimble, pins, pin cushion, thread, tape measure, and hem gauge. MUST be purchased and entered only once*)
3. Stitching Samples (*Youth exhibitors are to start sets of samples to be added to each year*)

Sample requirements: Based on years of sewing

<i>1st year – 6 or more</i>	<i>4th year – 24 or more</i>
<i>2nd year – 12 or more</i>	<i>5th year – complete set</i>
<i>3rd year – 18 or more</i>	

All samples should be mounted on notebook paper and fastened in a looseleaf notebook. Label each sample with the techniques name and tell the situation and fabric that requires its use.
